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# Background

- The ever-growing collaborative activities of the IOC Sub-Commission over the recent decades reflected substantive partnerships among marine scientists, institutions and Member States in the region in tackling various environmental, social and economic challenges, through enhanced cooperation in ocean research, innovations, and capacity development.
- Various Programs/Projects have carried out during the last few years, and Working Groups have also been established. It is worth mentioning, a network of Regional Research and Training Centers (RTRCs) addressing various ocean priority issues demonstrated commitments of Member States to collectively nurture the next generations- our Early Career Ocean Professionals (ECOPs).
- To strengthen all agenda from research to policy, which also in line with the national interest, need commitment not only among scientists in the region, but also among policy makers/senior governmental officials. Hence, Indonesia initiated, with the support of IOC Westpac Secretariat, to have first SGOs roundtable during the .











- Senior Governmental Officials from ten countries China, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand, USA, Vietnam and Indonesia) gathered at the SGOs Roundtable, during the 14<sup>th</sup> Intergovernmental Session IOC\_UNESCO Westpac region on 5<sup>th</sup> April 2023.
- Indonesia, with the support of IOC Westpac Secretariat, organized Roundtable (SGOs Roundtable) to facilitate the exchange and cooperation on the agenda of "Science we need for the ocean we want".
- The roundtable, as a follow up to the high-level commitment at the UN Decade Kickoff Conference for the Western Pacific (Nov 2021), has shared progress and exchange views on the development and implementation of the Ocean Decade,
- We also explored new opportunities for advancing ocean science development and cooperation among 10 SGOs.









# Conclusion and Recommendation

- The Draft Statement was agreed by SGOs from 10 member states.
- SGOs support all the statement which was called the SGOs' Jakarta
  Statement on the Decade of Ocean Science (5 April 2023).
- SGOs Roundtable also recommended an informal and open-ended Discussion Group on SGOs Roundtable, consisting the 2023 SGOs Roundtable chair country, and the Chair Country for the next SGOs roundtable, WESTPAC Advisory Group... to discuss the preparations and organization of the next SGOs roundtable in early 2025.





Senior Governmental Officials' Statement on the UN Decade of Ocean Science for the Sustainable Development (2021-2030) (SGO Jakarta Statement)

### Jakarta, 5 April 2023

We, representatives of the IOC Member States in the Western Pacific participating in the Senior Governmental Officials Roundtable, on the occasion of the 14th Intergovernmental Session of the IOC Sub-Commission for the Western Pacific in Jakarta, Indonesia, on 5 April 2023, appreciate the efforts being made by Member States and partners in the region to promote the UN Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021-2030) for our shared ocean. We also recognize that national governments must continue to support the development of transformative
