- TLK will support the route to sustainable ocean management based on "knowledge-based" ocean policy and "community-based" action or implementation;

2. Objectives







The overarching goal of the WG is to promote and incorporate traditional and local knowledge of the ocean in communities, particularly in coastal communities, into Ocean Literacy Action Programs to realize Outcome 7th of the ocean decade

Objectives:

- 1) Networking and inventorying of local communities' and traditional peoples' knowledge connected to ocean;
- 2) Developing and exchanging showcases and lesson learned based on the success stories of local communities' and traditional peoples' knowledge connected to ocean;
- 3) Building a strategic action programs of 5 years ocean literacy action based on local example/showcase to encourage communities changing their practices and habits, helping the conservation of ecosystems, biodiversity and human health to improve ocean health, as well as promoting their traditional knowledges and best practices in pro-ocean activity.

3. Major activities, outputs & outcomes







Latest accomplishment, particular those during 2023 to 2024

Major activities

- Socialization the Working Group to other regional initiative fora related to Ocean Literacy, such as APEC Blue Citizen and AIS Form and Global OECM (Other Effective Area based Conservation Measure);
- Inventorying of local communities' and traditional peoples' knowledge connected to ocean in Indonesia;
- Study on previous and current ocean literacy action based on traditional and local ocean knowledge in Indonesia.

Timeframe

Project start year: 2024

Outputs & Outcomes

- New WG member from PRC and Brunei Darussalam;
- Database of local communities' and traditional people's knowledge in Indonesia;
- 2 (two) showcase candidates for ocean literacy action based on traditional and local ocean knowledge in Indonesia.

4. Problems encountered & recommended actions







Problems encountered

- The changes in the organization of the IOC Indonesia National Committee in 2023, along with the new policy of BRIN, which serves as the governing body for the IOC Indonesia National Committee, have resulted in significant challenges in carrying out the activities of various Working Groups (WGs), particularly those related to coordination with regional WG members;
- In accordance with the revised organizational structure of the IOC Indonesia National Committee, the NDC is no longer recognized as a subcommittee, and the TLK WG is no longer a priority area for the Committee.

Actions

• We propose that the implementation of the TLK WG no longer be directly under the IOC National Committee, but rather be implemented directly by i-MAR. i-MAR is the Institute of International Research Cooperation on Ocean, Maritime and Fisheries, a collaborative research institute at Bogor Agricultural University that has an Ocean Literacy program.

Timeframe

Project start year: 2023

5. Strategic considerations/thoughts for future development







To expand participation and secure greater resource support from other regional institutions, it is essential to consider the following strategic actions:

- Collaborative action with AIS Forum (Archipelagic and Island States Forum) to develop and implement joint Ocean Literacy initiatives. These initiatives take the form of training programs and workshops.
- Collaborate with other potential regional initiatives, such as Blue Citizen and OECM.







6. Potential action plans for future implementation

- Developing Database of local communities' and traditional peoples' knowledge connected to ocean in the region;
- Seminar/Workshop on the Ocean Literacy Action based-on community-led traditional and local ocean knowledge in Western Pacific Region;;
- Develop Ocean literacy action project proposal for 2025-2030
